CAMU Application Status

- ◆ Draft CAMU application submitted by FMC to the Agencies March 27, 2008. FMC awaits comments back from Agencies. FMC will revise draft application based on Agencies' comments and finalize for Agencies' public meeting/public comment.
- ◆ Ten residents attended a Coffeehouse held May 29, 2008 at 7 p.m. to discuss questions and clarify some issues about the CAMU. Article about the Coffeehouse appeared in Lockport Union Sun and Journal on May 30, 2008.

RFI/CMS Update

- ◆ RFI Report Vol. I - Background and Related Information submitted April 30, 2008.
- ◆ Schedule for remaining RFI Report volumes –
 - Vol. II (Suspected Air Deposition Area So. of Erie Canal & West of Niagara Orleans County Line) - August 10, 2008.
 - Vol. IV (Culvert 105 and Flood Zone) - October 9, 2008
 - Vol. V (Tributary One and Flood Plain South of Pearson/Stone Roads) - December 8, 2008.
- ◆ Schedule for other volumes to be submitted in July 2008. FMC will continue to solicit input from the CIG and Village officials on schedule.
- ◆ CMS Work Plan for suspected Air Deposition Area submitted April 30, 2008.
- ◆ Draft outline and schedule for additional sampling north of Canal & east of county line - submitted May 9, 2008.

Grant Applications Update

- ◆ Sue Tauro to meet with to Nia. Co. Center for Economic Dev. about inclusion of Norco property buildings in county assessment program.
- ◆ Researching other funding opportunities with Greenway funding, Governor's WNY Projects Campaign and Casino Economic Development grants to determine applicability for projects.
- ◆ Reviewing submittal for round 3 of RestoreNY grants from the Empire State Development Corporation (ESDC).
- ◆ Preparing pre-application for Revolving Fund Program, USDA, to address Village's sewage treatment plant upgrades.
- ◆ Did not receive grant from Environmental Protection Fund to implement building design standards for buildings in the Central Business District (CBD).
- ◆ Waiting to hear about action on application submitted March 25, 2008 under NY Main Street grant program for various streetscape enhancements and revitalization projects in the CBD.
- ◆ \$250,000 grant awarded to Village from Sen. Maziarz for

Basket Factory public marina and promenade.

Water Treatment Plant Upgrades

- ◆ 99% of the upgrades are complete and were featured at the May 17 FMC plant Open House.

2008 Construction Activities

- ◆ Phase 2 ICM work to install an engineered cover over a section of the FMC-owned railroad property is scheduled for August 2008. Estimated construction duration is approximately 4-5 weeks.
- ◆ Remaining area on Wooded Parcel to be excavated this summer in accordance with the 2007 Early Action work plan.
- ◆ Remediation of 46 Park Ave. is targeted for completion in 2008 construction season. Remediation on 48 Park Ave. is pending subject to obtaining access permission.

Other Activities

- ◆ FMC is evaluating possible Early Actions for Culvert 105 north of Sleeper Street for the 2009 construction season.

Vapor Intrusion Study - On-site

- ◆ Data from the field sampling activities at FMC plant site on March 25 has been received and is being validated. Final report is targeted for a July submittal. (Study at Roy-Hart conducted in 2006 and 2007 showed no TCE contamination from vapor intrusion.)

Follow Up - 2007 Early Actions Project

- ◆ Trees were planted on M. Droman Park and Coe property. Erosion controls on the Wooded Parcel will continue to be monitored.
- ◆ Remaining work items related to 2007 Early Action Projects are also being addressed this summer.

Phytoremediation Pilot Study Update

- ◆ FMC submitted revised pages to the Pilot Study work plan on June 20, 2008.
- ◆ Plantings on two residential properties and on acreage north of the plant site began in June. Various other plants will be planted throughout the growing season.
- ◆ A coffeehouse to explain the Phytoremediation Pilot Study featuring Paul Deutsch of Geomatrix (Fresno, CA) to be held Sat., July 19 at 11 a.m. at the FMC Neighborhood House. Postcard invitations were mailed the week of June 30 to all Roy-Hart residents.
